Reflection

★ What helps you feel connected? (to the world, to family, to others, to God) Where do you feel you belong?

★ How might you connect with other pupils in your class or school that you don't know well?

*How could you connect more with your local community?



Connect with someone who is having a hard time. Do something together that will bring joy. Maybe watch a Christmas film or make a Christmas craft.

*Create messages, pictures, cards or gifts of encouragement for those who might feel unconnected and bring them joy.

Connect with others, by talking, playing, sharing food.






Iwonder...

Bible Passage

Matthew 1: 18-24;

Luke 2: 1-7; 16-20

*What did Joseph dream about?

Do you think Jesus' birth happened as Mary and Joseph expected or imagined it to?









*Who or what in your life is trustworthy?

*How can you be someone people can trust or depend on?

Light an LED candle as a symbol of hope. Trust God with your worries about the world.




Create a trust activity or game to help your class mates learn to work together and trust one another.


